After more than 20 years experience in ocean policy, sustainability, and resource management in Alaska and Washington D.C., I have for the past 15 years served as an environmental consultant to fishing organizations, government agencies and foundations.

My areas of expertise include project management, legislative and regulatory experience at the state and national level, both in policy and regulatory analysis and advocacy, environmental impact assessment, and environmental conflict resolution. I have worked for the Alaska legislature and Alaska Governor's Washington, D.C. office, and with national advocacy groups on reauthorizations of major U.S. environmental legislation.
